What's the greenest way you can get to Bridging the Tamar?

We are on a bus route, and it is also a short walk over the Bridge from Saltash Railway Station. Whilst you're here you can hire a Beryl Bike. If you fancy a hike we're part of the Tamara Coast to Coast Way.

Where will you eat lunch?

There are several local cafes in Saltash. For example, Community Enterprises PL12 has a Community Cafe. All the food a is surplus to the requirements of local shops and businesses – it would otherwise have gone to waste.

Recycle

We don't use single use plastics, and Suez is Zero to Landfill. Re-use reduce and recycle where you can.

Shop local

Use local products. They give you a flavour of the real Plymouth, St Budeaux and Saltash, and help support local communities. We are fortunate to have some fantastic producers of food, drink, arts and crafts locally.

Be water wise

Turn off the tap when you've washed your hands. Please do not flush inappropriate objects down the toilet (the 3 P rule – poo, pee and toilet paper).

Respect nature
