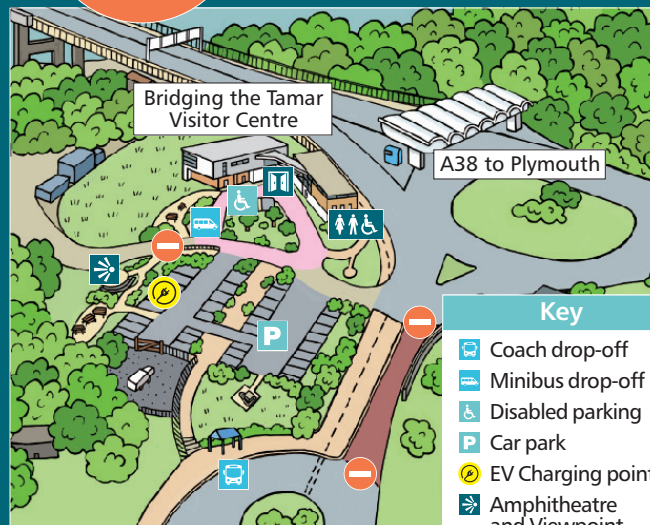
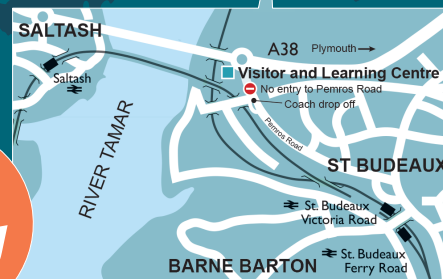
Pemros Road, St Budeaux, Plymouth PL5 1LP

You can also arrive by train in Saltash, or by bus (including the City Bus route 12/12A). Coaches drop off at the Pemros Road roundabout (no access to Pemros Road roundabout from Visitor and Learning Centre - coaches need to go through St Budeaux).

Free parking for cars is available, including 3 accessible spaces, and 2 Electric Vehicle Charging spaces.

Exhibitions

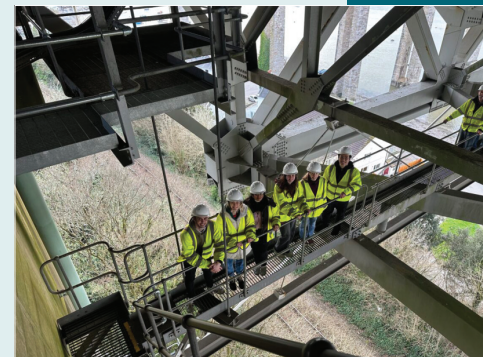
The exhibitions in the Visitor and Learning Centre tell the story of Brunel's Royal Albert Bridge and the Tamar Bridge.

- Interactive bridge models and displays.
- Picnic area overlooking the river.
- Spend an hour or two looking around the Centre or joining a guided tour.
- The Bridge is ideally situated to explore the town of Saltash which has many independent shops and cafés.



Guided talks

Public guided talks of the bridge run every Tuesday Thursday and Saturday at 11am (and 2pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays in summer).



School workshops

Schools can learn about the iconic bridges, experience learning outside the classroom, and enjoy a variety of curriculum linked workshops from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 4.
